On Tuesday, December 20, 2011, the Edgewood City Council held a regular meeting at Edgewood City Hall, 405 Larue Avenue, Edgewood, Florida. Council President Beardslee called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m. Council Member Powell gave the invocation followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Council President Beardslee noted for the record that there is one vacancy on Council and that Council Member Henley is absent due to medical reasons.

Motion by Council Member Powell to approve Council Member Henley's absence as excused, with Second by Council Member Dowless; the Motion was approved unanimously (3/0).

Council Member Dowless said a correction needs to be made in the minutes of May 17, 2011, and noted that the correction should be made on Page 6 (double negative). Council President pulled Consent Agenda Item 1 (A).

Motion by Council Member Powell to approve the Consent Agenda items B through F, with Second by Council Member Dowless; the Motion was approved unanimously (3/0).

Motion by Council Member Dowless to approve item A with correction made to Page 6, with Second by Council Member Powell; the Motion was approved unanimously (3/0).

Council President Beardslee announced that she wanted to move ahead to the second and final reading of Ordinance No. 2011-05.

PUBLIC HEARINGS (ORDINANCES – SECOND READINGS & RELATED ACTION)

ORDINANCE 2011-05: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF EDGEWOOD, ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA AMENDING SECTION 62-57 (REGULATION STANDARDS OF DISABLED VEHICLES) OF THE CITY OF EDGEWOOD CODE OF ORDINANCES TO INCREASE THE TIME ALLOWED TO PARK DISABLED AND UNREGISTERED VEHICLES ON SPECIFIC PROPERTIES; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION, SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

City Attorney Smith read Ordinance 2011-05 in title only.

Motion by Council Member Powell to approve the second and final reading of Ordinance No. 2011-05, with Second by Council Member Dowless.

City Clerk Meeks confirmed for Council President Beardslee that she received no written requests to speak. Council President Beardslee opened for questions and comments. Attorney Lee Chotas, 1205 Windsong Road, Edgewood, FL (representing SMD), stated that as a practical matter, “we support the revisions” to the Ordinance and urge that the amended Ordinance be approved. Having no further comments, the final and second reading was approved by roll call vote (4/0):

Council President Beardslee stated she was moving to Unfinished Business. She noted Council Member Bozeman’s resignation was announced at the November Council meeting, and explained the Charter requirements for filling a vacancy. She deferred to Mayor Bagshaw, who announced Lee Chotas as his recommendation to fill the vacancy. Mayor Bagshaw said that Mr. Chotas has already qualified for the January election, with no opposition, and will be on Council after the January 31, 2012 election.

Motion by Council President Beardslee to approve Mayor Bagshaw’s recommendation, with Second by Council Member Dowless; the Motion was approved unanimously (3/0).

Following Council approval, Lee Chotas was sworn in by City Clerk Meeks, and took his seat at the dais.

Review and Consideration of Russell Home Site Plan (moved from "Unfinished Business")

In response to Council President Beardslee, it was noted that there were representatives for the Russell Home in the audience waiting for the review and consideration of the site plan for the Russell Home. Council President Beardslee moved ahead on the agenda to address this item. She noted that City Engineer Miller was also in attendance for this agenda item.

Council President Beardslee deferred to Mayor Bagshaw, who asked Engineer Miller if he had some comments to give. Engineer Miller referred to his review and memo regarding the Planning & Zoning Board meeting. He noted that the Planning & Zoning Board recommended approval with conditions. He also noted that the submittals with revisions did satisfy his conditions.

In response to Council President Beardslee, Council Members indicated they had no comments or questions. In response to Council President Beardslee, Engineer Miller said that there have been no significant changes since May. In response to Council President Beardslee, the applicants had no questions or additional comments.

Council President Beardslee made the Motion to approve the Site Plan with the conditions noted in Engineer Miller's November 23, 2011 memo, with Second by Council Member Powell. The Motion passed unanimously (3/0).

Mayor Bagshaw asked to address stormwater issues with Engineer Miller before he left the meeting. Mayor Bagshaw said he received a call from a resident in Lake Mary Jess Shores and Commerce Drive (Engineer Miller said that the resident is Mr. Brown) complaining about a culvert, which is causing drainage problems. Engineer Miller said there is a wall between Mary Jess Commerce Center and Lake Mary Jess Shores Subdivision, with weep holes and swale on the commercial side that has been cleaned out at certain times. There is a pipe and when it is cleaned out, the drainage is fine. He said there are a lot of oak trees and leaves that Jerry Reynolds has had to clean it out. Engineer Miller said that the HOA is responsible for a portion, and the City for another portion. Council Member Powell said that based on the observations of Jerry Reynolds, who feels there is a lot of ground cover; the problem is caused by the water having nowhere to drain on Mr. Brown's property. City Clerk Meeks said that Jerry Reynolds has sent her pictures he took when responding to Mr. Brown's complaints. Jerry Reynolds told the City Clerk that there are times when he goes to the site following Mr. Brown's complaints, the site was dry. City Clerk Meeks said that if you look at the aerial view on the Property Appraiser's website, there appears to be a lot of ground cover. Engineer Miller said the wall was originally built 1986, with weep holes. The owners requested the City close the weep holes and the City did, but it affected the drainage. The City re-opened the weep holes and added swales. He said that Mr. Brown thanked the City for their help, and then the trees and leaves affected the drainage again, and Mr. Brown began complaining again about one year ago.

Council Member Dowless asked Engineer Miller about the independent engineering report that Legacy is required to do annually. Council Member Dowless said that the fee is onerous. Engineer Miller said he did copy Council Member Dowless in a response to City Clerk Meeks' email regarding this matter. He said that Legacy has not provided any reports. Engineer Miller

said the idea behind the requirement is so that the HOA was aware of their assessment, because of their responsibility as a private community. Engineer Miller said that maybe the Ordinance should be changed to requiring a report every three to five years, and after that, every year. Council Member Dowless said the HOA has recently been turned over to the homeowners. Engineer Miller said there is still some work to be done (remaining lift and resurfacing). Engineer Miller said that Beazer has a performance bond. Engineer Miller recommended amending the Ordinance one to five years after Certificate of Completion, then ten years. Engineer Miller said after ten years, you may want a report every year depending on what the engineering report says. Council Member Dowless requested the amendment.

Council Member Dowless made the Motion to review the Ordinance and amend the agreement with Legacy, as recommended by Engineer Miller. A friendly amendment was requested from Council President Beardslee, to include “review the Ordinance and determine if any amendments need to be made, then she Second the Motion. Discussion requested by Dr. Powell, who said he wants some detailed language as it relates to engineering report requirements. In response to Council Member Powell, Council President Beardslee said she accepted his amendment. The Motion passed unanimously (3/0).

Council President Beardslee asks City Attorney Smith to follow through on this request.

ORDINANCES – FIRST READING

1. **ORDINANCE NO. 2011-01:** AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF EDGEWOOD, ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CITY'S ADOPTED PERSONNEL POLICIES, PROCEDURES, AND RULES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

City Attorney Smith gave the first reading of Ordinance 2011-01 in title only.

Council President Beardslee made the Motion to approve the first reading of Ordinance 2011-01, with Second by Council Member Dowless. The Motion passed unanimously (3/0).

Council President Beardslee deferred to Council Member Powell, noting she was aware that he had some questions. Council Member Powell provided the following:

(Probationary Employer). Council Member Powell noted that Florida is an at-will employee State, and ask why have probationary periods when employees have benefits on day one of their employment. Council President Beardslee asked City Attorney Smith if the City has any defense since Florida is an at-will employee State. City Attorney Smith said “not really”. He said that when it comes to an unemployment hearing, the question will be “cause”. Council Member Chotas pointed out the inconsistencies on pages 62 and 64 of the Personnel Policy, and it was agreed that this was supposed to be changed.

Resident JT Blanton said that a probationary period is viewed as the right thing to do. Council President Beardslee said that she viewed the probationary period as a time for supervisors to earmark an employee's performance. Council Member Chotas said he feels you eliminate the ability to terminate an employee who may camouflage their abilities. Council Member Powell said the language is useless verbiage. Council Member Chotas said delete the language on page. 24 Probationary Employee/Probationary Period, and replace with 6 months on page. 62, Council President Beardslee said she feels an employee should still have a 90-day review. Mayor Bagshaw ask Council President Beardslee if can review further. Council President Beardslee asks if there was anyone who wanted to workshop again. City Clerk Meeks pointed out the conflict with not having a cafeteria plan Resolution in place, as the personnel policy doesn't address cafeteria plan. City Attorney Smith said he can push back discussion and move forward with adding cafeteria plan and still have first and second reading to change the personnel policy. Council Member Chotas recommended approving first reading with such revisions as may occur at second reading, and to have all the documents that will show Council the changes. Council President Beardslee said she has six areas in the policy that she wants to discuss, and believes her part will be at least an hour.

Council President Beardslee made the Motion to table approval of the first reading of Ordinance No. 2011-01 to February 21, 2011 City Council meeting, to allow for a workshop. Council Member Powell recommended January 10, 2011 at 3 p.m. Council Member Dowless Second the Motion which passed unanimously (4/0).

City Attorney Smith read Ordinance 2011-07 in title only.

Council Member Powell made the Motion to approve the first reading of Ordinance No. 2011-07, with Second by Council President Beardslee.

Council President Beardslee opened for discussion. Council Member Chotas said he provided City Attorney Smith with verbiage changes as follows:

- Line 77- replace - person or vehicle, which or who requires
- Line 82 replace - ~~escape from~~ the undesired conduct... to avoid the undesired conduct
- Line 91 change intimidate to intimidating

- Line 90 strike an-unwanted

City Attorney Smith read Ordinance No. 2011-08 in title only.

Council Member Powell made the Motion to approve the first reading of Ordinance No. 2011-08, with Second by Council President Beardslee.

Mayor Bagshaw said he opposes this Ordinance because the City will be one of the few cities to have this Ordinance in place. Additionally, he said the City raised the millage rate on the residents, and the commercial businesses do not pay ad valorem but receive the same services that the residents receive. He believes the current Ordinance is fair and reasonable and needs to stay on the book. Council President Beardslee said that she respectfully disagrees. She said that there is still ad valorem coming from the commercial real estate. She said she doesn't think it will put a dent in our budget. Mayor Bagshaw noted calls he is receiving because certain storefronts only allow certain businesses. Council Member Dowless said he originally supported the Ordinance but now is open based on Mayor Bagshaw's comments. Council Member Chotas ask for clarification of language in the Ordinance, and City Attorney Smith said the Ordinance removes a levy on the profession; there would still be a levy on the business. Council Member Chotas said perhaps delete "inequity". Council Member Chotas recommended passing on first reading.

Council President Beardslee stated her thoughts behind the Resolution and noted that Holland and Reilly said the City needed to have Cafeteria Plan in place because two employees have a cafeteria plan.

Council President Beardslee made the Motion to approve Resolution 2011-07, with Second by Council Member Powell with correction "ending September 30, 2014". Council President Beardslee called to question with correction, and the Motion to approve Resolution 2011-07 was approved unanimously.

STAFF REPORTS

1. Police Chief

Chief Marcus reported on the following:

- The December 10, 2011 Toys for Tots event. He noted that there was low attendance. He noted that there was an increase in toys and people are still bringing toys. Gave kudos to Council Member Dowless for the call out system, and gave judos to Mayor Bagshaw for the banners.
- The work related to the red light camera at Mary Jess and Holden is proceeding, and that he is working with the contractors. He said residents will receive a notice regarding the cameras.
- Burglary on December 15, 2011 at a business located on Jamaica Lane. Chief reported that his department has been able to recover the stolen goods, with the help of the Orlando Police Department.
- Working with a vendor on the possibility of obtaining a smaller camera that can be a cost effective way for getting good leads.
- Police personnel attended the December 19, 2011 Christmas event for Academy for Autism. His officers took up a collection and also gave them a "rehabbed" basketball goal.
- Reported on the Chief's conference he attended in Chicago. He said it is one of the largest police conferences particularly, for vendors. He said he is looking at a licensed tag reader to aid in looking for stolen cars. He feels the camera will be a very valuable resource. Mayor Bagshaw said he and the Chief discussed this and the camera would be an added safety for officers.
- Noted the resignation of Officer Zane.

Chief Marcus said Edgewood officers continue to patrol the City. Council President Beardslee said the door hangers making residents aware to lock their car doors is great. Chief Marcus closed his report by wishing Council a "Merry Christmas".

2. City Clerk

City Clerk Meeks reported on the following:

- Deferred Council to her status memo (informational only), and ask that they contact her with any questions or discussions.

- Noted that Request for Qualifications for engineering services are being submitted and the deadline for submittal is December 29, 2011. She asked Council for directions as to selecting a firm. Mayor Bagshaw said he is amenable to putting a committee together. In response to Council President Beardslee, Mayor Bagshaw said there is time to select a firm, as he has asked Engineer Miller to complete the NPDES requirements due in March. Council President Beardslee said “go ahead and get it done”, and requested the matter be placed on the January 10, 2012 Workshop agenda for the Mayor’s recommendation. Council President Beardslee said she is amenable to extending Art Miller’s contract for 90 days, with the Mayor allowed referral of projects to Engineer Miller; all council members in agreement.
- Expressed concerns about calls regarding pole signs and needs direction regarding referring technical questions to planner and/or engineer. Mayor Bagshaw said he is willing to contact a couple of sign companies to look at existing signs and see what can be done to dress up the signage. Council Member Chotas said that some business owners have not received the letter regarding the sign ordinance. City Clerk Meeks said that the letters were sent to the property owners. Council member Chotas said it makes sense to educate the sign companies to be able to respond to the owners. Council President suggested a meeting with the property owners to discuss. Mayor said he is just putting out options. Council Member Chotas referenced landscaping around the signs. Mayor Bagshaw said he thinks we can work with the property owners on the landscaping. Council member Powell said he doesn’t think it’s a good time to impose more costs. Council member Dowless said he feels staff should not have to answer the questions. Mayor Bagshaw recommended getting Planner Hardgrove and Engineer Miller’s input about a workshop.
- Waste Management fees increased due to CPI, aligns with the Agreement the City has with Waste Management.
- Requested directions on Hertz request to move their office from one location on South Orange Avenue, to another location on South Orange Avenue. City Clerk Meeks noted her concerns with the requirements of Ordinance 2010-02, which hasn’t been codified to date. It was agreed that Mayor Bagshaw would work with City Clerk on this matter.
- Noted the current Calendar, as it relates to holiday closing dates.
- Wished everyone Merry Christmas.

C. MAYOR & COUNCIL REPORTS

Mayor Bagshaw provided follow up on local business owners wanting to have a Farmers Market. He said they are considering having the market on Thursdays from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m., on City Hall property. In response to Council Member Powell, Mayor Bagshaw said there will be no vendor fees at this time. In response to Council Member Powell’s concerns about clean-

up, Mayor Bagshaw said that Jerry Reynolds will make sure the area is kept clean. Council Member Powell said the vendors should pay a deposit and then be reimbursed when clean up is done.

Mayor Bagshaw reported on his meeting with DOT, and thanked Council Member Powell for providing the contacts the contact information for Senator Andy Gardiner. Mayor Bagshaw said he feels DOT is being pushed to come up with a plan. Mayor said he has not given up on realignment at Gatlin.

Mayor Bagshaw reported that if proper name was not listed on City newsletter, it was discarded by post office staff. He said the City has corrected this and added "or current resident" so that the newsletter will be delivered.

Council Member Chotas reported that Harbour Island has a few thousand dollars for Azaleas. He noted that it has been brought to his attention that the street sweepers do not come across the bridge. Mayor Bagshaw said the City does not pay for street sweeping, and is done through water management. Council Member Powell said there are two types of street sweepers. He said Lake Jessamine Association is looking at the vacuum sweeper because of the number of curbs and the baskets for the stormwater. He said they are looking into the kind of contract they can get for that area. He said that MSTU funds pay for these types of things.

Mayor Bagshaw said the School for Autism sent a thank you book made of handprints. Mayor Bagshaw said that he has instructed Art Miller not to approve any Certificate of Occupancies in Legacy until they resolve issue of unpaid impact fees with Beazer Homes. Council is in agreement with the hold.

Council Member Dowless said he had nothing to report and wished everyone Merry Christmas.

Council Member Powell reported that Mike Heffinger, DOT, confirmed with him that he will be working with him on track maintenance. He said there will be dual tracks, and he is not pushing them on maintenance right now. Council Member Powell also reported on crossing concerns at Jamaican Lane.

Council President Beardslee noted the Mayor's hours in City Hall, and expressed her thanks to the Mayor for his work and substantial time in the City. She closed with wishing everyone Merry Christmas.

Having no further business, Council President Beardslee made the Motion to adjourn the meeting, with Second by Council Member Dowless. The meeting adjourned at 9:21 p.m.

ORDINANCE NO. 2011-07

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF EDGEWOOD, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 30, HEALTH AND SANITATION, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, TO CREATE ARTICLE IV, BEGGING, PANHANDLING AND SOLICITING ON SIDEWALKS AND STREETS, TO PROHIBIT PANHANDLING IN CERTAIN AREAS OF THE CITY AND AGGRESSIVE PANHANDLING THROUGHOUT THE CITY; PROVIDING LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS, PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS, CODIFICATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Edgewood desires to deal comprehensively with begging, panhandling and soliciting in accordance with current legal constraints in order to promote economic development and to address public health, safety and welfare concerns; and

WHEREAS, words with double underlined type shall constitute additions to the original text and ~~strike through~~ shall constitute deletions to the original text, and asterisks (* * *) indicate that text shall remain unchanged from the language existing prior to adoption of this Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Edgewood, Florida:

SECTION 1. Chapter 30, Health and Sanitation, Article IV, Begging, Panhandling and Soliciting on Sidewalks and Streets is hereby created as follows:

ARTICLE IV. BEGGING, PANHANDLING AND SOLICITING ON SIDEWALKS AND STREETS

Sec. 30-50. Legislative findings

The City Council recognizes a constitutional right to beg, panhandle or solicit in a peaceful and non-threatening manner. The City Council finds, however, that an increase in aggressive begging, panhandling or soliciting throughout the city has become extremely disturbing and disruptive to residents and businesses, and has contributed not only to the loss of access to and enjoyment of public places, but also to an enhanced sense of fear, intimidation and disorder.

Aggressive begging, panhandling or soliciting usually includes approaching or following pedestrians, repetitive begging, panhandling, or soliciting despite refusals, the use of abusive or profane language, unwanted physical contact, or the intentional blocking of pedestrian and vehicular traffic.

46 It is not the purpose and intent of this article to prohibit begging, panhandling or
47 soliciting in public areas when such activities will not interfere with vehicular traffic and
48 cause traffic safety and traffic flow concerns or when such activities will not otherwise
49 cause any public health, welfare and safety concerns.

50
51 This law is timely and appropriate because current city ordinances are insufficient
52 to address the aforementioned problems. The restrictions contained herein are neither
53 overbroad nor vague and are narrowly tailored to serve a substantial governmental
54 interest. Moreover, this article only restricts begging, panhandling and soliciting in
55 certain public places while preserving ample alternative areas for the valid exercise of
56 First Amendment constitutional rights.

57
58 The law is not intended to limit any persons from exercising their constitutional
59 right to beg, panhandle or solicit funds, picket, protest or engage in other constitutionally
60 protected activity. Its goal is instead to protect citizens from the fear and intimidation
61 accompanying certain kinds of begging, panhandling or solicitation that have become
62 an unwelcome presence in the city, and to prohibit aggressive begging, panhandling
63 and solicitation, and begging, panhandling and solicitation in certain public places based
64 upon significant governmental interests.

65
66
67 **Sec. 30-51. Begging, panhandling or soliciting on public property, sidewalks and**
68 **streets; certain designated places prohibited**

69
70 (a) Purpose. The City Council finds that any person who begs, panhandles or
71 solicits under circumstances that warrant a justifiable and reasonable
72 alarm or immediate concern for the safety of persons or property in the
73 vicinity by unwanted touching, detaining, impeding or intimidation which
74 causes fear or apprehension in another person constitutes a threat to the
75 public health, welfare and safety of the citizenry. The City Council also
76 finds that any person who intentionally blocks the passage of another
77 person or a vehicle, or who requires another person to take evasive action
78 to avoid physical contact, constitutes a threat to the public health, welfare
79 and safety of the citizenry, and is an aggressive panhandler. The City
80 Council further finds that any person who begs, panhandles or solicits
81 under circumstances where the person being solicited cannot readily
82 avoid the undesired conduct constitutes a threat to the public health,
83 welfare and safety of the citizenry.

84
85 (b) Definitions. Except where the content otherwise requires, as used in this
86 chapter:

87
88 (1) Aggressively beg, panhandle or solicit means any request made in
89 person for a donation of money or some other article of value from
90 another person by an unwanted touching, detaining, impeding or
91 intimidating. Aggressive begging, panhandling or soliciting includes

92 approaching or following pedestrians; repetitive begging,
93 panhandling or soliciting despite refusals; the use of abusive or
94 profane language; unwanted physical contact; or the intentional
95 blocking of pedestrian and vehicular traffic. Also, any person who
96 intentionally blocks the passage of another person or a vehicle,
97 which requires another person to take evasive action to avoid
98 physical contact, is an aggressive panhandler.
99

100 (2) Beg, panhandle or solicit, for purposes of this Article, means any
101 request made in person for a donation of money or some other
102 article of value, either by words, bodily gestures, signs or other
103 means, from another person.

105 (3) Beg, panhandle, or solicit from any operator or occupant of a
106 vehicle that is in traffic on a public street means any request made
107 in person for a donation of money or some other article of value,
108 either by words, bodily gestures, signs or other means, from any
109 operator or occupant of a vehicle, coupled with an actual exchange
110 of money or some other article of value between the person
111 begging, panhandling or soliciting and any operator or occupant of
112 a vehicle while that vehicle is on the portion of a public street
113 currently in use by vehicular traffic.
114

116 (4) Obstruct pedestrian or vehicular traffic means to walk, stand, sit, lie
117 or place an object in such a manner as to intentionally block
118 passage of another person or a vehicle, or to require another
119 person or driver of a vehicle to take evasive action to avoid physical
120 contact. Acts authorized as an exercise of one's constitutional right
121 to picket or to legally protest, and acts authorized by permits issued
122 pursuant to this Code, are not included within the definition of this
123 term.

124 (5) For purposes of this Article beggar, panhandler or solicitor means
125 any person traveling either by foot, vehicle or other conveyance,
126 from place to place, requesting in person a donation of money or
127 some other article of value, either by words, bodily gestures, signs
128 or any other means, from another person.
129

130 (c) Restrictions and requirements.
131

132 (1) Beggars, panhandlers or solicitors are prohibited from intentionally
133 obstructing pedestrian or vehicular traffic.
134

135 (2) Beggars, panhandlers or solicitors are prohibited from aggressively
136 begging, panhandling or soliciting.
137

138 (3) Beggars, panhandlers or solicitors are prohibited from begging,
139 panhandling or soliciting from any operator or occupant of a vehicle
140 that is in traffic on a public street, as those terms are defined in this
141 article unless the beggar, panhandler or solicitor:

142
143 i) has obtained and has in his or her possession a permit
144 issued by the City of Edgewood Police Department for the conduct
145 of such activity; the application fee for such permit shall be set by
146 Resolution of the City Council and the permit shall state the location
147 at which the begging, panhandling or soliciting is permitted;

149 ii) is at all times, while soliciting from any operator or
150 occupant of a vehicle, wearing a bright orange, yellow or green
151 traffic safety vest; and

153 iii) does not touch or otherwise physically interfere with any
154 vehicle upon the public right-of-way.

156 (4) No person shall stand on a traffic median, bicycle path or public
157 street to beg, panhandle or solicit when to do so would obstruct
158 vehicular traffic.

162 **Sec. 30-52. Penalty**

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163 Any person convicted of violating any of the provisions of this division shall be
164 punished as provided in Sec. 1-7 of this Code. In addition to any criminal enforcement,
165 the City or any individual may pursue any available civil remedies deemed appropriate
166 and necessary.

167
168 **SECTION 2 - SEVERABILITY.** If any Section or portion of a Section of this
169 Ordinance proves to be invalid, unlawful, or unconstitutional, it shall not be held to
170 invalidate or impair the validity, force, or effect of any other Section or part of this
171 Ordinance.

172
173 **SECTION 3 - CODIFICATION.** It is the intention of the City Council of the City
174 of Edgewood, Florida, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this Ordinance
175 shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinance of the City of Edgewood,
176 Florida; that the Sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered to
177 accomplish such intention; that the word, "Ordinance" may be changed to "Section,"
178 "Article," or other appropriate word.

180 **SECTION 4 - CONFLICTS.** All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with
181 any of the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

183 **SECTION 5 - EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Ordinance shall become effective

14 WHEREAS, this ordinance amends Chapter 34 of the Edgewood City Code in
15 accordance with the Local Business Tax Act; and

19 business location or branch office within the city, for the privilege of engaging in or

22 WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Business Tax Act, local governments are
23 authorized to collect a business tax from “[a]ny person who maintains a permanent
24 business location or branch office within the city, for the privilege of engaging in or
25 managing any profession or occupation within the city;” and

27 WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Edgewood, Florida desires to
28 eliminate the requirement that persons engaging in or maintaining any profession or
29 occupation within the city procure a separate business tax receipt when the business
30 employing such person has already procured a business tax receipt.

32 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
33 CITY OF EDGEWOOD, FLORIDA:

35 Section 1. That Article II of Chapter 34, Section 34-19 of the City of Edgewood
36 Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

38 Sec. 34-19. Local business tax imposed.

39 (a) For purposes of this article, the term "business," "profession" or "occupation" shall
40 include all individuals, corporations, associations, syndicates, joint stock companies,
41 partnerships of every kind, joint ventures, clubs, trusts and societies engaged in any type
42 of work, occupation or profession unless exempt under federal or state law.

43 (b) No person listed below shall engage in any business activity whatsoever, within the
44 city until a business tax receipt shall have been procured from the city clerk, which
45 receipt shall be issued to each business that is not in violation of this article, or other

46 ordinance, or laws of the state, after receipt by the city clerk of a business tax receipt
47 application, and on receipt by the city clerk of the amount hereinafter provided:

48 (1) Any person who maintains a permanent business location or branch office
49 within the city, for the privilege of engaging in or managing any business within the city.

50 (2) Any person who maintains a permanent business location or branch office
51 within the city, for the privilege of engaging in or managing any profession or occupation
52 within the city, provided, however, that such person shall not be required to procure a
53 business tax receipt if such person is employed by a business that has obtained a business
54 tax receipt pursuant to subparagraph (1) for the business in which such person practices.

55 (3) Any person who does not qualify under subsection (b)(1) or (2) of this
56 section and who transacts any business or engages in any occupation or profession in
57 interstate commerce, if the business tax is not prohibited by United States Constitution,
58 Art. I, § 8.

59

60 Section 2 Conflicts. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with any of
61 the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

62

63 Section 3 Severability. If any section, sentence, phrase, word or portion of this
64 Ordinance is determined to be invalid, unlawful or unconstitutional, said determination
65 shall not be held to invalidate or impair the validity, force or effect of any other section,
66 sentence, phrase, word or portion of this Ordinance not otherwise determined to be
67 invalid, unlawful or unconstitutional.

68

69 Section 4 Codification. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be codified as and
70 become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Edgewood. The
71 Sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention
72 and the word "Ordinance", or similar words, may be changed to "Section," "Article", or
73 other appropriate word. The Code codifier is granted liberal authority to codify the
74 provisions of this Ordinance.

76 Section 7. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective immediately
77 upon its adoption.
