

RESOLUTION NO. 2021-05

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF EDGEWOOD,
FLORIDA, ADOPTING A REVISED TREE REPLACEMENT
STOCK LIST PURSUANT TO SECTION 130-7 OF THE
CODE OF ORDINANCES**

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Edgewood adopted Ordinance 2013-08 providing for adoption of a tree replacement stock list by resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City's Arborist has provided recommendations regarding trees more appropriate for the replacement tree stock list; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it appropriate to revise the tree replacement stock list in accordance with the recommendations of the Arborist.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EDGEWOOD, FLORIDA:


Section 1. The following tree replacement stock list attached hereto as Exhibit "A" is adopted pursuant to Section 130-7 of the City of Edgewood Code of Ordinances:

Section 2. Conflict: Any and all resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. Severability: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this resolution is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion thereto.

Section 4. Effective Date: This resolution shall become effective upon its adoption.
