



Elder Ambassador Program



The Elder Ambassador Program (EAP) is a volunteer outreach effort of the Orange County Commission on Aging (COA). The COA was established as an official advisory board of Orange County Government in 2001. The COA serves as the link between Orange County's Mayor, Board of County Commissioners, and local community partners and citizens of Orange County.

Established in 2014, EAP volunteers are dedicated to making Orange County an elder-friendly community. Through this team of community volunteers, it is hoped more elders, caregivers, and families can better connect to community resources available in Central Florida.

This program aims to assist elders, their families, and caregivers become more aware of elder services and opportunities in the community.

Elder Ambassador Volunteers attend training programs to learn about the vast elder services network – home health, residential care, dementia support services, and much more!

Volunteers share their knowledge by giving presentations to various community groups as well as participating in local resource and health fairs. This community outreach is provided free of charge.
